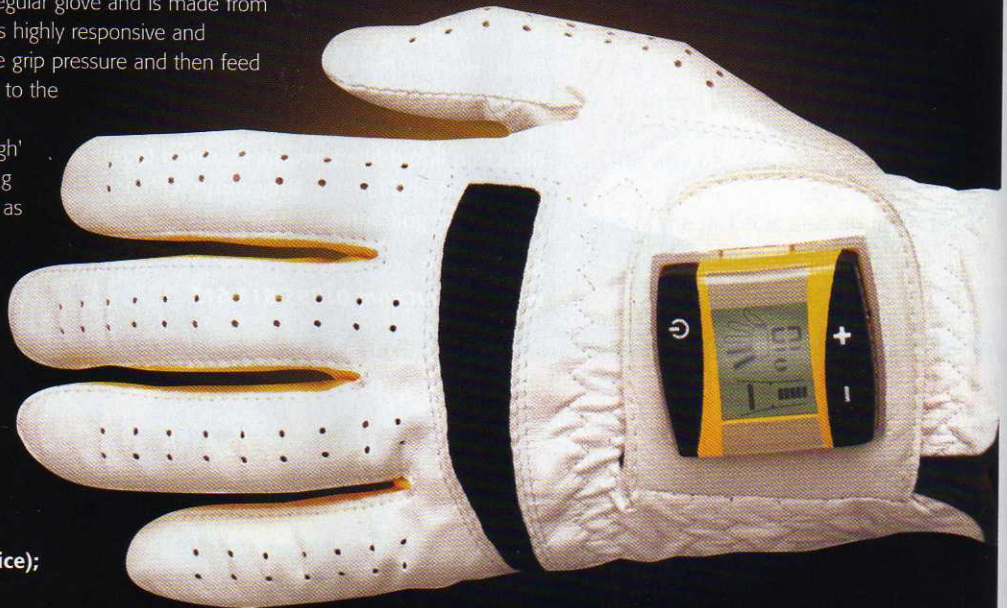
## A grip that responds to pressure

**A new computerised glove could transform the way golfers learn to regulate grip pressure – which is one of the key factors required to produce a smooth and powerful swing.**

The SensoGlove looks and feels like a regular glove and is made from high-quality cabretta leather, but includes highly responsive and strategically placed sensors that measure grip pressure and then feed the data into a small computer attached to the back of the glove.

Used during practice, it has 'low' or 'high' sensitivity modes. Should you be gripping too hard it emits an audio signal as well as providing an instant visual readout on the computer's 3cm wide screen, which can be removed when the glove wears out.

David Bauer, of SensoSolutions, said: "Gripping the club too tightly is one of the most destructive flaws in a golfer's technique because it causes muscle tension, which itself leads to poor rhythm and jerky movement."

To celebrate their 90th anniversary, John Letters have produced a limited-edition set of the Pro F-90 irons, with only 400 sets being produced. The classic-looking head of these irons has been forged from super-soft 1020 Carbon Steel to give ultimate feel.

Dynamic Gold shafts and Golf Pride DD2 grips top off an excellent package that comes with a certificate of authenticity.

### New model for Dixx

THE DiXX Putter has already helped hundreds of golfers improve their putting – but with some great new features and a new head shape, even more can benefit.

This is the perfect tool for those who love gadgets and also want to make serious improvements to their putting. But it is not just restricted to amateurs and thanks to a new mode, pros can also hone their skills with a smaller set of tolerances.

A new addition is a moving diagram of your swing path as well as existing features that track all aspects of your putting stroke including impact position, face angle, swing tempo and speed balance.

Results are shown on a screen in the body of the putter and you can scroll through the data.

The putter comes in mallet and blade shapes for those who prefer a sleeker look. In both models the screen can be substituted for weights to take your new stroke out onto the course.
